# Friendship City of Shinagawa Let's Get to Know Geneva, Switzerland!

Shinagawa City and Geneva, Switzerland signed a friendship charter on September 9, 1991, and last year marked the milestone thirtieth anniversary of the relationship. Friendship ties started between the two cities after the bell of Honsenji Temple in Minami-Shinagawa, lost after it was taken abroad for an exposition, was discovered in Geneva's Ariana Park. ### **Characteristics of Geneva**

**Features of the city:** The largest city of the Canton of Geneva, Geneva is located on the western end of Lake Geneva and ringed by the Alps and Jura Mountains. The city's old town, which has a rich history and culture, is situated on the left bank of the Rhone River.

On the river's right bank are many international institutions, such as the European headquarters of the United Nations and the headquarters of the International Committee of the Red Cross. Four languages are recognized as official national languages: French, German, Italian, and Romansh. Since many Swiss people speak

### Honsenji Temple Bell

The temple's bell was lost in Europe but later found in Geneva's Ariana Park and returned to Honsenji Temple.

Location: 3-5-17 Minami-Shinagawa Nearest station: About a five-minute walk from Aomono-yokocho Station.

### Geneva Heiwa-dori Street

Because of the Honsenji Temple bell connection, Geneva gave Shinagawa a sign that says "Avenue de la Paix ('Peace Street' in French)" as a gift. Although the Tokyo Metropolitan Government has control over the street, the street was named Geneva Heiwadori (Geneva Peace Street) at the request of local residents having friendly ties with Geneva.

**Nearest station:** About a one-minute walk from Aomono-yokocho Station.

### **Flower Clock**

To commemorate the friendship charter's tenth anniversary, Geneva presented these clock hands to Shinagawa City. Shinagawa's flower clock was constructed using the famed Flower Clock in Geneva as a model.

Location: 4-12-6 Higashi-Shinagawa (plaza in front of Aeon Style Shinagawa Seaside) Nearest station: About a four-minute walk from Shinagawa Seaside Station.

# Are You Familiar with National Health Insurance?

#### What Is National Health Insurance?

Japan's social security system includes health insurance. This health insurance program is broadly divided into workbased (company) insurance, regionally based National Health Insurance, and Latter-Term Elderly Medical Insurance for those who are 75 years of age or older. Those who live in Japan are required to join one of these health insurance plans. (However, eligibility requirements for enrollment must be fulfilled.) Japan's National Health Insurance system is a mutual-aid program in which members pay insurance premiums based on their income, and to which both the national government and local municipalities also contribute.

#### • Who Can Enroll?

Under 75 years of age who live in Shinagawa City and have completed resident registration can enroll. However, those to whom any of the following applies are not eligible to enroll.

- Those who are eligible to join another public health insurance program, such as company health insurance **Note:** Those who are employed by a Japanese company should enroll in the health insurance plan of that company (place of employment).
- Those who are receiving public financial assistance for everyday living
- Those with an authorized period of stay of three months or less
- (including those who have not obtained the proper visa)

#### Notification

You must be sure to file the designated notification form with the National Health Insurance and Pension Section within fourteen days of the following circumstances. Your individual number (My Number) is required for procedures.

**Note:** If someone else files an application on your behalf, he/she will need to present a proxy letter.

- (1) To join the program
  - When you enter Japan or move to Shinagawa City
    When you withdraw from the employee health
  - When you give birth to a baby (if you cannot
- enroll in social insurance) (2) To withdraw from the program
  - When you move out of Shinagawa City or leave Japan
  - When you join the employee health insurance program
  - Death
  - Note: You can apply for funeral expenses.
- (3) Other situations
  - When you move within Shinagawa City
  - Change in name
  - Change in head of household
  - Consolidation or dissolution of household(s)
  - Your health insurance card is lost or damaged

### Booster Shots—Omicron Variant Vaccine

**Eligibility:** Residents twelve years of age or older who have completed the initial vaccinations (first and second injections) and got their previous vaccination (second through fourth injection) at least five months ago.

**Location:** Vaccinations are scheduled at group vaccination sites and medical institutions such as hospitals, medical association halls and clinics.

**Reservations:** Applications are accepted via the website or through the call center. **Note:** Vaccines used at group vaccination sites and medical institutions are gradually switching to the vaccine for the Omicron variant.

### Booster Shots (third injection) for Children (five through eleven years of age)

Children between the ages of five and eleven who got their second injection at least five months ago can receive the booster shot (third
