Courses:

1) Part I—For those who have never studied Japanese before: Morning, afternoon and evening classes

2) Part II—For those who understand Part I (*te*-form of verbs, dictionary form, *imasu/arimasu*, etc.): Afternoon and evening classes

3) Part III—For those who have already studied Parts I and II above or who have completed *Minna-no Nihongo* volumes I and II and other materials: Afternoon and evening classes

Dates and times:

1) and 2) Tuesdays and Thursdays, from September 26 through December 5 (total of 20 classes), excluding November 23.

3) Mondays and Wednesdays, from September 25 through December 4 (total of 20 classes), excluding October 9.

Morning class: 10:00 a.m. to noon

Afternoon class: 1:30 to 3:30 p.m.

Evening class: 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

Eligibility and capacity: Sixteen foreign residents per course (lottery if number of application exceeds the capacity)

Babysitting: Available for up to two children between two years old and preschool age per class time; ¥5,000 yen per child during the period (on a first-come, first-served basis). **Tuition:** ¥7,000 per course (textbook fee included)

Shinagawa Uchimizu Strategy 2023: Lowering the City's Midsummer Temperature by 2°C

• Create a gentle midsummer breeze in town with *uchimizu* (a traditional practice of sprinkling water in gardens and on the streets to cool the surroundings in summer).

Dates: July 23 (Sun.) to Aug. 23 (Wed.)

Uchimizu procedures:

1. Have water ready.

- It is a good idea to use recycled water such as water left over after a bath. 2. Sprinkle the water on the ground.
- Sprinkle the water freely together with your family and neighbors.
- 3. Enjoy the coolness.
- The water sprinkled on the ground will cool the surroundings. We recommend

doing this in the morning or evening, since the cooling effect lasts longer. **Note:** Shinagawa City is offering rental goods for *uchimizu* (ladles, pails, buckets and flags), and distributing commemorative *uchimizu* gifts (cool neck towels). About COVID-19 Vaccinations

For Residents Sixty-Five Years of Age and Older and Residents with Underlying Conditions

You can receive the Omicron-specific vaccine if more than three months have passed since your last vaccination.

Eligibility and Vaccination Ticket Mailout

- Residents who are sixty-five years of age and older
- You can use unused vaccination tickets to get vaccinated if you have any. If you do not have a vaccination ticket, you must apply for one.
- Residents between five and sixty-four years of age with underlying conditions or whom doctors recognize as having a high risk of developing complications, and healthcare workers

You can use unused vaccination tickets to get vaccinated if you have any. If you do not have a vaccination ticket, you must apply for one **Notes:**

- 1. Residents other than the eligible persons will not be able to get vaccinated.
- 2. Residents between six months of age and eleven years of age will remain eligible for vaccination.
- 3. Vaccinations for residents five years of age and older are scheduled to begin in September.
